The location of Hutchins is magnificent and the campus extensive. The School overlooks the Derwent River and is located in the capital city, Hobart. Hobart has a population of approximately 200,000 people and enjoys a mild climate with warm summers and crisp winters.

The city offers exceptional lifestyle opportunities with concerts and sporting events, outdoor expeditions and live theatre, a sense of history and a sense of security. It is a safe and beautiful city and is said to have the cleanest air in the world.

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A very high academic standard is maintained with approximately 95% of Year 12 students gaining University entrance. Hutchins has a strong tradition of performing arts. A progressive and state-of-the-art Music School with performance and rehearsal rooms, recording studios and audio design suites complements the drama studio and Terence Butler Auditorium used for larger productions. Robotics and electronics, design and technology is leading-edge at Hutchins School.

## CULTURE AND COMMUNITY

Hutchins is an Anglican School for boys which, in co-operation with parents and through a stimulating, personally fulfilling and caring environment, strives to produce confident young men of good character whose spiritual, intellectual, cultural, physical, emotional, social and vocational development fully equips them to take their places as responsible working members of the global society. The School has a very strong leadership program encouraging community service and good citizenship. Awards are issued recognising service.

## PASTORAL CARE

At Hutchins pastoral care of a student is everyone's responsibility. A vertical house system with Head of House, House Tutor, Residence supervisors, careers counsellors, school counsellor and supportive network of teaching and non-teaching staff ensures that every student is provided with many avenues for quiet discussion of any concerns or assistance and support with subject, projects and their personal pressures.

Highlights – Academic Achievements:

In TCE examinations (university entry scores) Hutchins students consistently achieve among the highest scores in the State. The School is proud that it has produced 24 Rhodes Scholars (Oxford University, United Kingdom, prestigious scholarship students).

Pathways:

Hutchins students are offered a direct pathway entry into University of Tasmania and other Australian Universities. Students achieving an ATAR of 85 or more, are eligible for a University of Tasmania scholarship entry. Joint Offer of Place from The Hutchins School and University of Tasmania is able to be packaged ensuring students have an upfront pathway to University. A great advantage. Many Hutchins students receive scholarship offers to Universities around Australia. Hutchins' students are accepted by leading Universities in Australia and other countries globally.

## ACADEMIC COURSES

Number of courses offered:

In Years 11 and 12 approximately 100 subjects are offered. Students in Years 7 – 10 may select from a smaller number of subjects including core and elective subjects.

Courses available for international students:

All courses offered are available to international students. Courses offered at Year 11 and Year 12 include: Accounting, Economics, Mathematics (5 levels), Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Psychology, Sociology, Sport Science, Environmental Science, Agricultural Science, English, , Computer Graphics, Design & Technology (including Robotics, Housing and Design, Computers and Design Graphics), Geography, History, Ancient Civilisations, Health Studies, Tourism Studies, Adventure Education and many, many, more...

Languages:

Chinese (Mandarin), Japanese, French, Latin, German and ESL.

## THE HUTCHINS ELICOS CENTRE

The Hutchins School boasts a fully accredited ELICOS Centre for boys and girls. Boarding accommodation is provided for students. Students may enter 20 week block, high school preparation English language intensive courses as required by Assessment Provider recommendations, or as a transition program prior to mainstream school entry. Students applying to The Hutchins School, St Michael's Collegiate School (the sister school of Hutchins) are encouraged to apply as spaces are limited. Students who are intending to enter into interstate schools or other Tasmanian schools are also able to apply. Priority is given to students who will continue their schooling at Hutchins or Collegiate schools. This accredited CRICOS registered ELICOS course specialises in school-aged students and provides a boarding school environment in a safe, community-minded and fully supervised environment in the amazing city of Hobart, Tasmania. Following transition into Hutchins or Collegiate schools, English as a Another Language/Dialect (EAL/D) support is ongoing and placed into EAL/D classes as one of their elective subjects. ## ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Entry Assessment is required for international students - iSTARTOnline [www.istartonline.com](http://www.istartonline.com) or AEAS [www.aeas.com.au](http://www.aeas.com.au) is accepted and a SKYPE interview will be required.

## CO-CURRICULAR PROGRAM

Sports and Outdoor Education:
